The Zulch Estate.

The commissioners, Messrs. E. B. Seay, J. C. Morris and S. D. Nichols, appointed by the court, with consent of all parties concerned, completed the work of partioning the estate of J. Zulch, turning over to each interested party their portion of the estate which was found to be worth as a whole, \$82,242.16, which did not include \$8,000 in life insurance, nor previous gifts to Misses Pearl, Davey and Cora Zulch. One half of the \$82,242.16 went to Mrs. Zulch, widow of J. Zulch, the other half being equally divided between the nine original heirs. In addition to one-half the estate Mrs. Zulch receives the life insurance. Mr. Seay, one of the commissioners, said the estate was in fine shape and the per cent of uncertain claims was less in proportion to the vastness of the business than any estate he ever had dealings with.—Madisonville Meteor.
