

H. B. No. 457

A BILL
TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT providing for the control and management of the affairs of the Chappell Hill Independent School District in Madison County, Texas, to be vested in the County Board of School Trustees; providing that the control and management of said District shall hereafter be vested in the County Board of School Trustees to be exercised by it in the manner now authorized by existing laws; repealing all laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The control and management of the affairs of the Chappell Hill Independent School District of Madison County, Texas, as defined in House Bill No. 554, Chapter 35, of the Local and Special Laws of the Thirty-fifth Legislature, 1917, shall hereafter be vested in the County Board of School Trustees to be exercised by said County Board in the manner now provided by existing laws.

SECTION 2. All laws and parts of laws in conflict herewith are repealed.

SECTION 3. The crowded condition of the calendar creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the Constitutional Rule requiring bills to be read on three several days in each House be suspended, and said Rule is hereby suspended, and that this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted.
