— AN ACT creating the Hollis Independent School District in Madison County, Texas, defining its metes and bounds, providing for a board of trustees therefor, vesting it with the rights and duties of districts incorporated for school purposes only under the General Laws, and declaring an emergency. —

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:-

Section 1. That the Hollis Independent School District is hereby created in Madison County, containing within its limits the following described territory, to-wit:--

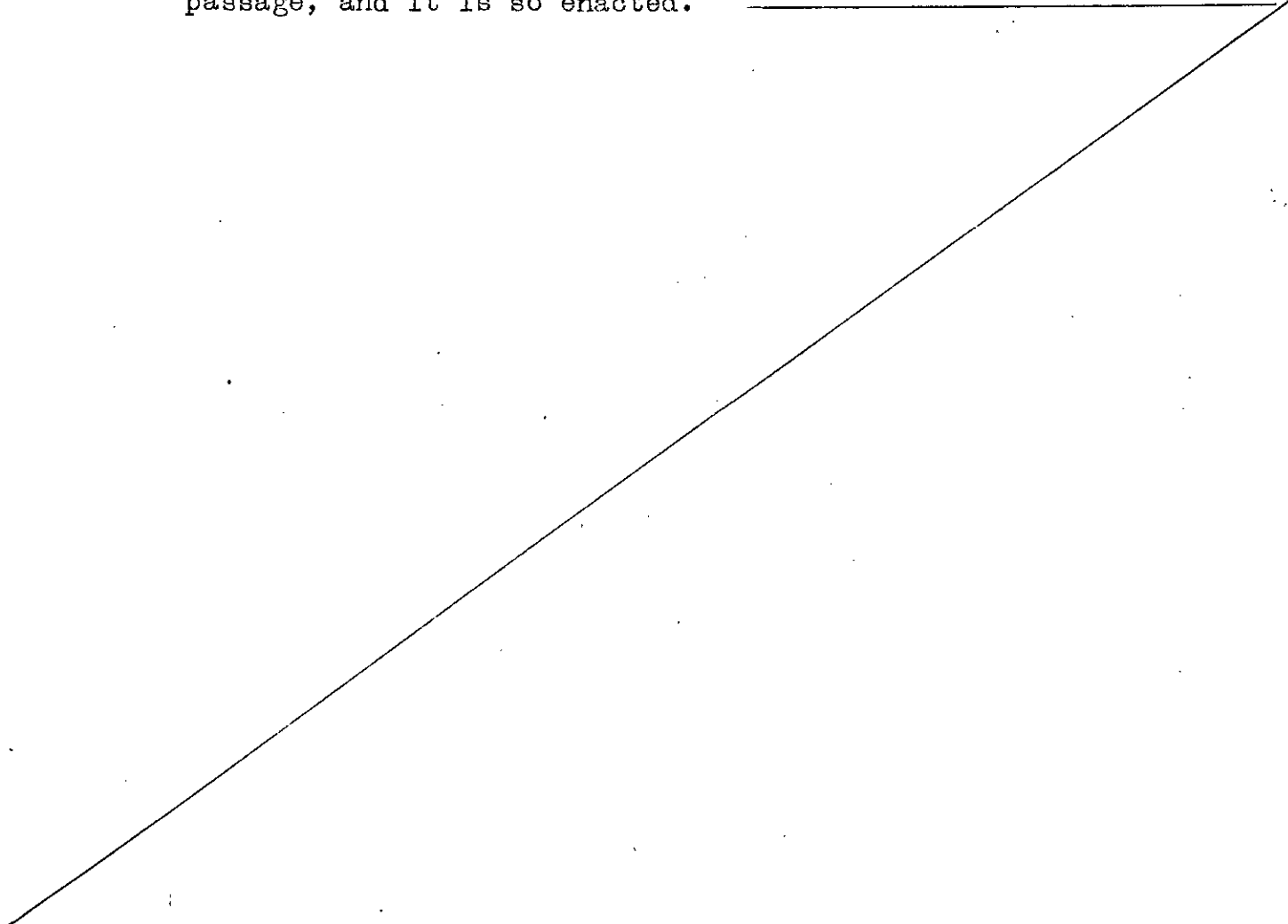
Beginning at the S. E. corner of the Arter Crownover League; thence N. 10 E. 5014 vrs. to the N. E. Corner of Arter Crownover League; thence S. 80 W. 5022 vrs. the N. W. Corner of Arter Crownover League, and passing said corner at a distance of 439 vrs., a stake for corner; thence N. 10 E. 126 vrs., a stake for corner; thence S. 80 W. 1169 vrs., a stake at the N. W. corner of L. Jackson Preemption; thence S. 10 W. with the west line of the said Preemption 1250 vrs., a stake for corner; thence S. 80 E. 40 vrs., a stake for corner; the same being on the north boundary line of the Champion Blythe and the South boundary line of the L. Jackson Preemption; thence S. 15 W. 2439 vrs., a stake for corner; thence S. 80 E. 30 vrs., a stake for corner; thence S. 10 W. 1013 vrs., to a stake for corner; thence S. 80 E. 97 1/4 vrs., to a stake for corner; thence S. 10 W. 1022 vrs., a stake for corner; the same being the S. W. Corner of Mrs. O. P. McMillan's 200 acre tract in the Champion Blythe League; thence S. 80 E. 1162 vrs., the same being the S.E. Corner of said McMillan tract; thence N. 10 E. 684 vrs., to the S. W. corner of the Arter Crownover League; thence S. 80 E. 5022 vrs., with the south

boundary line of said league to the place of beginning and containing nine and eleven-eighteenths($9 \frac{11}{18}$) square miles. —

— Section 2. The said Hollis Independent School District is hereby vested with all the powers and duties of an independent school district organized under the general laws of this State.

— Section 3. The control and management of the schools of the Hollis Independent School District is hereby vested in a board of seven trustees, to be elected in accordance with Section 164 of Chapter 124 of the Acts of the Twenty-ninth Legislature. —

— Section 4. The deplorable condition of the public free schools within the territory herein described being now without adequate school buildings and wholly insufficient equipments, and without funds to provide for same, creates an emergency, and an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule, requiring bills to be read on three several days be suspended, and that this act take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and it is so enacted. —
